Education: Master's degree in psychology, social work, behavioral sciences or related field. Preference given to licensed candidates.

Duties:

- 1. Work closely with other staff as a member of a treatment team.
- 2. Complete intakes, assessments and treatment plans as appropriate.
- 3. Conducts outreach and treatment for children and their families.
- 4. Develop and maintain strong collaborative relationships with a wide range of community partners, including, but not limited to: school districts, DHS, Crook County Juvenile Department, and Health Department.
- 5. Provide individual, group, family counseling, and case management, working collaboratively with treatment team members and other agencies.
- 6. Maintains accurate documentation of all services in client files within agency stated timelines.
- 7. Lead psycho-educational, skill development, process, gender-specific, and family groups as assigned.
- 8. Work closely with referral sources, keeping them informed on the progress of the clients, as needed and as compatible to client confidentiality and HIPAA.
- 9. Model appropriate counselor behavior to other staff; help train and orient new staff to the program as necessary.
- 10. Complete training/certification required to perform mental health crisis work and possibly be part of the MH crisis rotation.
- 11. Other duties as assigned by the Program Director and/or Clinical Supervisor.

Minimum Requirements:

- Ability to work effectively in multiple cultural contexts is essential.
- Ability to develop strong collaborative relationships with a range of community partners required.
- Flexible scheduling required including possible evening hours.
- Must possess knowledge, skills, and abilities demonstrating competence in the following essential job functions:
 - Treatment of mental health and substance-related disorders including client evaluation and individual, group, family and other counseling techniques.
 - Program policies and procedures for client case management and record keeping.
 - Accountability for recording information in the assigned client files consistent with policies and procedures and applicable Oregon Administrative Rules (OARs).
- Must have demonstrated competencies to identify precipitative events; gather histories of mental, emotional and physical disabilities, alcohol and drug use and substance abuse disorders, past mental health services and criminal justice contacts.

- Assesses family, social, and work relationships; conducts mental status assessments; document a multiaxial DSM diagnosis.
- Write and implement or supervise implementation of a treatment plan.
- Conduct and document a mental health assessment.
- Provides mental health treatment and rehabilitative services within the scope of his or her practice.
- Must possess the ability to work independently and the skills to be a team player. Must have the
 ability to get along with co-workers. Possess the ability to network with all resources in order to
 provide the best customer service. Use good customer service skills with the clients or family
 members seeking help from our program.
